Dave Bencic emailed the following comments which were read by Supv. Crossen:

- 1. I read the agreement online. Thanks for making it available.
- 2. This appears to be non-exclusive, which I would think means that any other cable company could come in the town as long as they "sign up" and have another agreement with the town. This appears to be a good change from the previous agreement.
- 3. As per the proposed agreement, the cable company must pay the town a 5% "fee" to continue to operate in the town. This "fee" can be added to residents cable bills as an added cost. Therefore, in my opinion, this is NOT a franchise agreement but just a hidden town tax on residents who have cable service. I realize that the consumer must pay for everything indirectly, but this is a direct town tax on cable service, and no other cable company can come in unless they collect the "tax" and give it to the town. This does not seem right.

I have the following questions. You may not answer it as part of the public hearing, but I would appreciate an answer sometime.

- 1. Is my spectrum internet service considered "cable" and subject to this agreement? If so, that is about \$30 a year more I have to pay the town.
 - 2. Will the internet service be subject to the 5% "fee" to the town?
